ACBS Glacier Lakes Chapter Meeting and Tour – Saturday, April 16, 2022

The coffee was flowing, the donuts didn't disappoint, and enthusiasm shined during the **Glacier Lakes Chapter** meeting recently at the *All Hands Boatworks* Shop in Milwaukee. Executive director **Bill Nimke** and his crew proudly showed attendees around their new 8,600 square foot facility. AHB currently is leading the construction of more than eight wooden boat projects, including three Periwinkle Jr. skiffs, two 12' Bevin's rowing skiffs, a 12' outboard, and a 13' outboard skiff being built by an all-women's group led by Jane Larson.

Bill treated the group to the organization's new promotional video, which can be viewed on its new website, *www.allhandsboatworks.org*. Check it out. You will not be disappointed. Now in its ninth year, *All Hands Boatworks* continues to provide unique youth development and job readiness training through wooden boatbuilding projects and onthe-water activities. "Kids throughout the Milwaukee area, collectively, have built more than 123 boats with us," said Bill.

The group also had a chance to meet two of AHB's extraordinary volunteer instructors and to learn about their own current boat projects. **Ed Koscik**, a retired math teacher who now lives in Okauchee, spoke about the teaching "tricks" he incorporates whenever he leads a student boatbuilding project. Recently, he has been one of the instruc-

tors in a weekly project class with girls from St. Joan Antida High School. Ed also showed us another current project of his - A Chesapeake Light Craft stitchand-glue Oxford Rowing Shell.

Trent Myers, another long-time volunteer instructor at AHB, explained the initial steps of setting up the strongback and station moulds for his 18' Calendar Islands Yawl, being built from a kit produced by Chase Small Craft (Saco, ME). Trent expressed his gratitude for being provided shop space for his project, but he was quick to remind everyone that he is here for the kids. "I love building small boats," he said, "but you quickly discover at All Hands Boatworks that it is about much more than the boat."

The group also were treated to a visit to the Boat MKE shop, located in the lower level of All Hands Boatworks. **Boat MKE** is embarking on its fourth season, renting boats to take out on the Milwaukee River. The business specializes in refurbishing retro outboard boats from the 1950-1960 era. In the course of four short summer months. Boat MKE will do almost 2,000 rentals! 
Wednesday's Women Walkers becomes LadyBuilders of Boats

Friendships are a wonderful thing and wonderful things come out of a friendship. Friendships are based upon respect, appreciation for each other's qualities, and a strong will to aid and assist the other person(s) because one recognizes their greatness. A group of female friends, who had met vears before through sailing on Lake Michigan, formed a Wednesday walking group during the pandemic as a way to get some exercise, support each other and bask in each other's successes. As winter turned to summer and summer gave way to another winter, this group of friends kept on walking. And talking. And dreaming. One woman's dream was to build a wooden boat for her soon-to-be new home on the Milwaukee River, just north of Milwaukee. As any good friend does, she asked for the support of her Wednesday Walkers. Thus, the LadyBuilders of **Boats** came to be

Terry (the dreamer of boat building) connected with "All Hands Boatworks" (AHB), a non-profit boat building organization. Despite being youth oriented, Terry and AHB agreed that a female adult boat building group would fit in well with AHB's community program. Terry had visions of a wooden boat, propelled by an outboard motor that would be large enough for two adults and a small handful of grandchildren; yet wouldn't take years to build. After some research, AHB found the Bayview Skiff 13, a wooden boat kit designed by Clint Chase of Chase Small Craft in Maine. There is only one other Bayview Skiff 13 in existence so the *LadyBuilders* would be building the 2nd Bayview Skiff 13.

The *LadyBuilders* (consisting of about 5 women) meet once a week on Wednesdays for 2.5 hours. Orientation began on 1/26/2022 and construction began on 2/2/2022. The kit arrived in sheets of marine plywood and the pieces were cut out, sanded and of course, epoxied. As anyone who has built or repaired wooden boats, you know that there is

always sanding and epoxying to do! Under the guidance of Will Francis (Job Skills Director and Boatbuilder Extraordinaire) and Ed Koscik (Volunteer Instructor) cleats were cut, bulkheads glued, knees attached, frames created, scarfs epoxied, dry fits done, and chines cut...glued...& planed. As of 4/20/22 the bottom was glued on. (BTW, the boat will be held together with epoxy... not screws.) Every LadyBuilder has an opportunity to try every task and every piece of machinery from band saws to chop saws, belt sanders to spindle sanders, planers, angle measurers, drivers...you name it! Soon we will put the top side boards on, epoxy and paint, attach the hardware and before you know it, we'll be launching her. (Stay tuned for an update on the final project!) I am honored to be part of the LadyBuilders, as I am honored to be part of the Glacier Lakes Chapter of ACBS. I cherish these friendships; and the stories that are part of these friendships are just as important. So, keep the stories coming! One of a few design challenges in an outboard skiff is how to introduce enough flare in the hull sides up forward so that people inside feel secure and spray is potentially knocked down before coming into the boat. The Compass Skiff solves that by utilizing some compound curvature in the hull sides and bringing the bow up high in the bow. The other design challenge in a skiff this size is making her feel bigger than she really is. The Compass Skiff solves that by having more than ample freeboard. The construction is all 9mm Okoume plywood built over bulkheads and a midship frame. The kit utilized Chase Small Craft's tab-n-lock system of assembly where no strongback is required. The timber kit includes a variety of hand-selected hard and softwoods, typically White Ash for the rubrails, Eastern White Pine for seat, and a Mahogany or Oak keel
