



Andy McCormick's WINTER PROJECT

It's been said, the vintage runabout represents an era of "lost craftsmanship"....I beg to differ. With a little guidance from Don Danenberg's book, "The Complete Wooden Runabout Restoration Guide", Andy McCormick was inspired by Don's insight & experience and tackled restoring the bottom of a 1968 Century Resorter over the winter. Rallying together the help of some friends, they rolled over the wooden hull in early October of 2009.

Here is a little background. This was the very last year Century manufactured "wood" boats. It's a fun, fast little boat being that it's only 15' long with a Chrysler 318 engine. We bought the boat from a widow in Minocqua, WI who was selling all her husbands past toys. The boat's interior had just been replaced prior to putting it into storage over eight years ago.



Our garage became the dusty hang-out of the winter for socializing, entertainment, and camaraderie. Andy incorporated his own wood working skills & craftsmanship replacing the old single planked bottom with a new 5200 double bottom. The old, original planks were saved for patterns only! Replacing each bottom plank with all new mahogany wood, purchased from where else..."McCormick Lumber", located in Madison, Wisconsin.

Andy applied the 3M-5200 to all the surfaces of the frame, so that there would be no voids to later trap & hold water. Being that the boat is less than 20', he used 1/8" Okoume marine plywood (also available at McCormick Lumber). For boats over 20', it is recommended to use 1/4" marine plywood. Once the plywood was laid he tacked it into place with stainless steel staples held just tight enough to be evenly embedded to the frames...since they will soon be applying a couple thousand screws into it to secure the new planks!

Andy and his crew also sealed the plywood with CPES (clear penetrating epoxy sealer), which essentially glues the wood fibers together to make the surface stronger for the bedding compound application.







Here the guys are installing the new mahogany planks that were earlier all dry-fitted before installing. Dry fitting each plank was were Andy's true craftsmanship shined through! Again they are applying the 3M-5200 with a calk gun and then evenly spreading it with a trowel being sure to eliminate any voids under each plank.

TEAMWORK is required to get all the fasteners installed before the 5200 rubber can set. This boat required over 2,000 new silicon bronze screws! You never want to reuse the old brass screws, as they may have become stressed & weak over the past 40+ years.

Once both sides were completed, they watered down the new planks and covered it with plastic to hold in the moisture over-night. This will cause the wood to expand a bit, oozing the rubber out between each board, creating a water-tight seal. The hard part is now finished....other than filling each & every screw hole....that's over 2,000 screw holes, may I add!





After the screw holes have been filled & dried, the bottom planks were all sanded down to form a smooth & even bottom. Once again, the wood was sealed with CPES and allowed to cure, before applying the epoxy primer coats and finally two coats of the bottom paint. It's now February 2010, and the boat is back in its upright position. Its engine, upholstery, and chrome parts have all been reinstalled, and the boat is ready to go.... ...once spring arrives and melts away our ice covered lakes!





This boat will not only look pretty, but we will no longer have to hope the boat's battery can keep up with the bilge pump running....we now have a new 5200 Bottom!!!!

Andy, I am so proud of you in a "JOB WELL DONE"!!! And a special thank you to Mark Walters, Mark Baumeister, Mike Lizon, Red Luther, Chuck Deadman, Glen Shubert, Steve Krause, and Steve Bethke for helping Andy with this project.






