Roberta Hegy Building a Glen L "Torpedo" SPRING BANQUET SPEAKER

Roberta retired from We Energies after 40 years. One of her goals was to build a mahogany boat. She previously built two airplanes. She retired from active flying and aircraft ownership.

Roberta made contact with the Glacier Lakes Chapter at the Milwaukee Boat Show in 2011. Roberta liked what she saw and joined the chapter. Roberta has

become very active and is now a Director. Roberta started building her first boat in 2010 and finished it in 2011. That boat is a Glen L Zip which is a 14.5 ft outboard runabout. Her second boat is a 10 ft outboard hydroplane, called the Glen L Super Spartan, that she built for her two grandchildren. Roberta is now in the process of building a new Glen L design called the "Torpedo". It is a 19.5 ft inboard single cockpit runabout reminiscent of the older Ventnors.

Roberta's presentation will focus on building a "Torpedo". She will be showing photographs and explaining the building process of the Glen L "Torpedo". This will be done in several segments starting in the Spring 2014 chapter meeting and others in the future as she progresses through the build. This segment will include frame building, laminating motor stringers, setting up on the building form, setting the keel and other longitudinals, drilling the prop shaft hole, fairing the boat for planking, and cold molded double diagonal planking with plywood. Roberta hopes you can attend the chapter at the Spring meeting for an interesting evening, a nice meal, and great camaraderie.


GLACIER LAKES CHAPTER

Charlie Shong Presents Seminar about Pewaukee Lake

Charlie Shong, one of Glacier Lakes newest members will put on an educational seminar about Pewaukee Lake. The first will be "The History of Pewaukee Lake" at 7 p.m. Wednesday, Feb. 12. (before you receive this newsletter) Charlie Shong will talk about how Pewaukee Lake was formed and will explain how the lake changed its flow path or doubled in size. There will be plenty of visuals.

A second seminar is slated for 7 p.m. Wednesday, March 12, on "Invasive Species (Milfoil) Management." Learn about what the district has done over the years, and what management tools the district uses to allow for lake recreation opportunities. Shang's presentation will include the lake's characteristics, the depth differences in the east and west basin to mention a few topics.

Charlie Shong as Superintendent was in charge of the Lake Pewaukee Sanitary District for 20 years but worked for the district for 32 years. He retired in 2012.



Mary Richter, owner of Fine Yacht Finishing, LLC started her wood finishing career working in her mother's antique business in the 1970's. She built her first wooden boat at age 20 while earning a Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in Design, from UW Oshkosh in 1983.

Living in Alaska for most of the 1980's and 90's offered boating opportunities in ocean kayaking, class 5 white water rafting, and an 1800 mile boat delivery. Mary delivered a new commercial fishing boat from Kenai, Alaska to the Bering Sea fishing grounds north of Dutch Harbor and commercial fished for 6 months. After working for BP on the Arctic Ocean near Prudhoe Bay as safety personnel and EMT, she opted for a change of pace and moved to the east coast restoring several classic wooden boats and racing a 12 meter boat with Gary Jobson.

After returning to Wisconsin in 1997 her involvement in the building of the 3 masted schooner "Denis Sullivan" turned into a full time job working with Bill Emery, former Manager at Palmer Johnson and contributor at Swan. A full blown love of beautiful, high end, classic boats, and their care was born.

Mary is a long time member of South Shore Yacht Club, Member of US Sailing, Safety at Sea Certified, hold a US Coast Guard OUPV/6 pak Great Lakes Captains License, and is a new member with the Glacier Lakes Chapter of The Antique and Classic Boat Society. She operates Fine Yacht Finishing, LLC (www.fineyachtfinsihing.com) as a Marine Finishing Specialist in the Great Lakes and Caribbean, and races big fast sail boats on Lake Michigan for fun. She is known to appear in mermaid form on boats beautifully varnished by Fine Yacht Finishing, LLC.

Scott Bruesewitz held a seminar for the Glacier Lakes Chapter in 2013. When Scott was 7 his family's first boat was a 16' Cruisers Incorporated Labstarke Runabout. He joined South Shore Yacht Club(SSYC) in 1968 as part of the Junior Sailing Program. His first restoration was an 8' fiberglass sailing pram in the basement of his family home. Thru high school, he developed an addition to work on boats. In his junior year of high school, he took a weekend job at the local boatyard, which became his career. It was there that he learned the skills of fiberglass repair and hull painting. One boat he restored led to his first National Championship in the International 210 Class. Scott had the opportunity to sail to Australia and sail in places including Hawaii, Jamaica, England, New Zealand, and France. 2013 ACBS International Meeting and Boat Show in Coeur d'Alene Idaho





A Comparison of Emergency Flares

Kurt Rothe, The Sheerline Editor sent this article a few years ago. It was lost and just reappeared. The article was published in the The "Sheerline", newsletter magazine of The Sunnyland Chapter. Kurt thought it might be appropriate for the Glacier Lakes Newsletter "At the Water Line" as some of our members do their boating on Lake Michigan and other larger bodies of water.

Kurt-thank you for forwarding the story.

Before we left the San Francisco bay area to cruise the Great Circle Route on the east coast, we had the opportunity to attend a 'Flares Shoot Off' session that was sponsored by the Cal Sailing Club in Berkeley, California. If you ever get the opportunity to attend to one of these, you should definitely go. It was very informative in that you got the opportunity to learn about the different types of flares that are available, as well as learning how to safely set them off. Everyone who attended had the chance to actually set off one or more flares. While Svensen's Chandlery of Alameda as well as the Demera Group donated in-date flares for the event, attendees were encouraged to bring their expired flares in order to set them off and/or safely dispose of them. As anyone knows who's tried to dispose of old flares, it's not that easy. They are considered 'hazardous waste' and therefore you are not allowed to just throw them out in the trash.

About 50 people attended the event together with lots and lots of expired flares. Most folks brought flares that expired in the early 90's. Only aerial and hand-held flares were permitted. Smoke flares were not allowed due to the proximity of the shoot off to a busy highway.

Bob Clark, an Orion flares representative was also on hand during the event to provide details and instruction on the proper, safe usage of the various types of flares that were demonstrated and ignited by participants.

We dug-out our 'oldest-of-the-old' flares, mostly SOLAS parachutes and hand-held flares with expiring dates ranging from the mid 1980s into the early 1990s. Like pretty much everyone else there with old flares, we had stored them inside our boat in waterproof bags.

Besides having the opportunity to actually shoot off the flares, the most interesting part of the day was seeing the failure rates of the old flares. Granted, this was not a full blown study of all flare types but there were definite patterns based on the type of flare and brand for what worked well and what didn't. From the worst to the best, these were our observations and conclusions based on what we saw that day.

Skyblazer hand-held pencil flares

To say that we were disappointed in the performance of these flares would be an understatement. Of the 6 we brought, 5 did absolutely nothing. The one that we did manage to shoot off did not ignite. Granted ours had expired, but there were some other folks there with current versions and they had similar results. I've heard these have really high failure rates, but I honestly didn't expect it to be that bad.

12 Gauge Flare Guns

We didn't bring any of these, but lots of other folks did. Almost all fired (maybe 90%), but they went maybe 100ft and were back down into the water within the blink of an eye. You'd have to be looking in the area of the flare at the time it was shot up in order to see it – not very impressive. I've heard that if you use this type of flare, you need to be prepared to shoot off at least 3 of them in succession about 10-15 seconds apart. The reason is that they are up for such a short period of time, that the casual observer may doubt that they actually saw the flare first flare at all.

25mm Flare Guns



There are two types of 25mm flares, the regular type that go up and then come right down similar to the 12 gauge flares as well as parachute flares. The 'up and down' flares seemed to have a failure rate of about 20% - slightly higher than the 12 gauge. The ones that went off, however, seemed to go higher and burn brighter than the 12 gauge flares. The 25mm parachute flares were markedly better. They all fired, went much higher and came down slowly – providing prolonged visibility.

SOLAS Parachute Rocket Flares

Easily the best flares by far were the self contained SOLAS parachute flares. These flares come in a tube where you pull out a pin and then push a tab up to set them off. We brought along 8 of these and they all shot off. The only failures we had were that one didn't ignite after it was shot off and one didn't deploy the parachute. They were, however, pretty old – probably 15 years past their expiry dates. The ones that did deploy were really bright and went much higher than anything else that was shot off (including the 25mm parachute flares). Since they have a parachute, they came down slowly – again providing prolonged visibility. Probably the best part of the flares was the fact that, unlike flares that require a gun to shoot off, they did not kick back at all when they

were deployed. Since they are self contained, they are also easier and quicker to deploy than those requiring a gun. All of ours were Pains Wessex, and we noticed that they seemed to go higher and burn brighter than some of the others brands that were there.

Hand-held flares

Something we didn't expect to see was the huge failure rate for the large hand-held SOLAS flares. We were only able to get 3 of the 7 we brought to ignite. They also seemed a bit risky to use. One of them started to shoot flames from the back end as it was burning down. Fortunately our friend Jim, who was holding it, quickly dropped it into a very large puddle. Even the ones that did work correctly were dropping hot bits of stuff off as they burned down. You'd definitely want to wear gloves when you light them and make sure you are holding them downwind and way out over the water. I could just imagine burning a hole in a life raft while holding one of these things. We noticed that the flares where you pull a string on the bottom had a much higher success rate of going off than the ones where you twist the bottom and give it a hard belt with the palm of your hand. We didn't get any of ours that were that type to ignite at all. Some other folks also brought some, and they only got one to ignite. Of all of the hand-held flares that did ignite, the Pains Wessex were by far the brightest and burned the longest.

Conclusion

Based on our observations, we plan to continue to buy and carry the self-contained Pains Wessex parachute flares. Even though they are pretty expensive, they seemed to be the easiest and safest to use and provided the best visibility. We no longer carry any of the Skyblazer flares and we've relegated our remaining 12 gauge flares to our dingy.

We especially want to thank Jamuel P. Starkey Vice Commodore of Cal Sailing Club for sponsoring this event. We know from talking to him that it was not an easy event to get scheduled, as it required permits from the city as well as approval from the Coast Guard. It was, however, one of the most interesting and valuable events that we have attended in a long time.
