



from the Commodore

A few months ago I decided my home office was in need of some reorganization and cleaning. This required moving things around and during that process I had to pull out my collection of what I call "Coffee Table Books". These are pretty books often subject orientated and wrapped in covers with nifty photographs. I don't have a huge collection, but I do have several that I either purchased or were gifts from my family as I became increasingly involved in classic and antique boating.



The first book I pulled out and got side tracked with had nothing to do with boating. It was a "The Complete History of Chrysler Corporation 1924-1985" by Richard M. Langworth. It is a thick book with a lot of text and photographs. I pondered to myself whether I'd actually ever read the book – or just looked at the pictures. As I started reading I realized I had either read it and forgotten most of it, or never read it in the first place. Reading about the early history of the automobile as the author set the stage for the formation of Chrysler Corporation was fascinating and covered the period in brief from the late 19th century to the early 20th century. As many of you realize, this same period of time coincides with the early development stages of power motor boating and so it was no surprise to find out Walter P. Chrysler saw an opportunity to enter into the manufacture of Chrysler Marine engines.

It took me quite a while to read that whole book and made me aware that I probably had a few more such books that I had merely scanned upon acquisition, promising myself to go back and spend more time on the text at a later date. Several years as a matter of fact. I decided to continue this project of review and pulled out "Grand & Glorious – Classic Boats of Lake Geneva" by Larry Larkin. This is another fascinating history of some of the earlier launches and, then, later speed boats that called this beautiful lake home. I began to sense symmetry of history here as Larkin discussed the history and aspects of a number of these boats in Chapter 1. One doesn't have to read long before the names of John L. Hacker and Gar Wood in addition to a number of local boat builders become attached to some very significant vessels.

Next I moved through "Classic American runabouts – Wood Boats 1915-1965" by Philip B. Ballantyne, and then "Classic Speedboats – 1916-1939" by Gerald Guetat. Sorry Gerald, your name is supposed to have a designation mark over the "e's" that I can't find on my keyboard. Never-the-less, this book took me into much of the history of motor boat racing in the early 20th century. What I found interesting was how early some of these boats were breaking speed records going faster than 60, 80, 100 mph. Much of this racing development was a direct result of the imagination of Gar Wood. It wasn't long before Gar Wood and Christopher Smith teamed up to build such race boats as the Miss Detroit and Miss America series, among others. Gar Wood had such a lock on the "Gold Cup" series of races that the committee running the races actually changed the rules in 1922 in an attempt to change the outcome of the race and regain some lagging interest. Wood's response was to move on to the European race theatre and challenge for …..and win the Harmsworth trophy. The usual team for many of these trophy wins was a boat designed by "Nap" Lisee, built by Chris Smith & Son's Boat Company, driven by Gar Wood with Jay Smith (one of the Smith sons) as his co-pilot.

Prevalent through this reading I was captured by was the realization of just much of the development of the planning hull, displacement hull and hydroplane hull took place early on in power boat racing. Of course, without the coinciding development of the engines that powered these boats the new records would not have been set.....and broken....and broken again. Prominent engines on the scene were the Allison, Chrysler, Liberty, Scripps, and Packard – all with their own stories of development.

Now, I'm in the process of finishing up "Gar Wood Boats – Classics of a Golden Era" by Anthony S. Mollica Jr. Gar Wood was completely dedicated to racing motor boats. It was his first love. While his family was well off – it was Wood's invention of the hydraulic pump and adaptation to create the "dump truck" in the early 1900's that gave him the financial independence to pursue his passion of building and racing power boats. As Wood phased out of racing and into building fine pleasure runabouts, many of the lessons learned developing racing boats and motors found their way to Gar Wood's Boats. While looking at some of the pictures in this book of the Gar Wood factory built in Marysville, Michigan, I was drawn to the picture that shows a number of hulls bottom up while being planked. I never realized the extreme "V" that his boats came to at the stem and forefoot area. Also interesting to note is that while opened on January 1st, 1930, this new factory – the most modern every built – never really ran in the black – and in fact – opened on the eve of the Great Depression. This book is a great read and while I'd swear I read it when I bought it, I sure missed a lot the first time around. It was only a short few years after Gar Wood stepped down from his Chairman's post at Gar Wood Industries that consultants shuttered the boat building arm of the company.

There are many more names, boat builders, engine manufacturers and historical incidents I've come across in reading through the books I've read before. It would be easy to write several more columns of materials. We'll save this for another time.

So there you have it. If you're someone like me who has stacked up a bunch of wonderful books with great photo's and much historical text regarding history in general and history specific to our great avocation of classic and antique boats, and if, like me, you've always wondered how some of these people at the boat shows can spout facts and stories intelligently and perhaps, endlessly.....it may just be that they read the books they've bought or been gifted. I've also come to realize that one read through is not enough. These books – like our boats – were meant to be cared for and treasured and, yes –used. Let's see – looking over my shoulder at my bookshelf I see "The Legend of Chris Craft" and "Classic Century Power Boats". Gotta go.....I've got some reading to catch up on.




Jay was at his house/shop up to three times a week, sometimes 15 minutes and other times 2 hours. Mark said "I will miss Jay very much."



Glacier Lakes will vote on this proposal at its spring dinner, April 20th.



Fiberglass Seminar a BIG Success!

Glacier Lakes members gathered on Saturday March 16th for the first ever seminar on fiberglass. With 40 years of boating experience, it was Scott Bruesewitz's first atempt to put on such a seminar/workshop presentation. Scott and Debbie joined Glacier Lakes Chapter, ACBS after the 2012 Pewaukee Boat Show.

As we all know, pretty much of 99.9% of all work shop/seminars are aimed at wood boats. This was a first for Glacier Lakes in that the focus was on fiberglass boats. It was held at The Giuffre-Rexworks Industrial Warehouse at 445 W. Oklahoma Ave., Milwaukee.

It was obvious to all the attendees that Scott did a lot of preparation for this event. Scott had displays of pictures of some projects, his reference books and of course coffee, juice and bagels.

At 10am, Scott started talking about his latest project – his second 1955 Permacraft – referred to for now as "Ester". After introductions, Scott launched into a brief history of fiberglass and when the first fiberglass boats were produced. The first polymers were developed in 1847, with the first patent for weaving fiberglass cloth awarded in 1880. By the mid 1930's Owen-Illinois was using 'fiberglas' as a trademark. FRP – Fiberreinforced plastic is fiberglass reinforced with plastic (resin). GRP – Glass Reinfused Plastic. FRP made its first appearance in 1935, with other types to follow as well as various types of GRPs.

The 1940's marked the first appearance of fiberglass boats – Ray Greene led the way (1942), followed by Gar Wood Jr (the garform in 1946-1950) and Taylor Winner (Plasticraft Recreational boats 1946). The Garform was a direct result of the radar domes that had been produced for the war. Taylor Winner had built patrol boats for the Navy.

By 1950 there were 22 FRP boats displayed at the New York boat show.

The 1950's brought about GRP and the introduction of GelKoat by Glidden and Gelcoat by PPS. In the early 60's half of the boats at the New York boat show were fiberglass, by the late 60's, only one wooden cruiser was displayed at the Miami Boat Show.

Next up was the discussion of the construction process and how fiberglass construction varied from the construction of a wooden boat. He said for a wooden boat you start with the keel and frames and then add the skins, plywood or planking. The fiberglass boat starts in a mold with the gelcoat. The skin is then laid up using a variety of fabrics. This segued into a discussion of the various types of cloth available and the advantages of each type. These included matt, woven roving, stitched cloth, carbon fiber, and Kevlar. With this also came the discussion of the various resins and epoxies that should be used with the various cloths. Scott offered his methods and personal experiences with the various products. Along with this was a brief discussion on the proper safety gear and equipment as well as procedures. Cleanup process and products were also touched upon.

Back to the construction process, Scott continued describing how the boat would be built utilizing Ester as a visual aid to explain the process and show examples of the construction. The entire presentation was fairly informal and questions were fielded during the talk as well.

Repairs and the tools utilized and again the safety equipment needed was then covered. Scott pointed out that Ester served as a prime example of a rather large project. She now is completely gutted and Scott could describe the process of grinding the area out and replacing stringers and how the project would proceed. Scott then covered the problem of rot in encapsulated stringers, frames and transoms. The detection, causes and solutions for these challenges were discussed.

Everyone then moved out to the general shop where the other projects were displayed. First stop was the 14' Duo transom repair. A detailed discussion of how that repair would progress prompted many questions and answers.

Scout then turned to his boat, Chloe. Chloe is the "after" of Ester. Chloe debuted at the Pewaukee Boat show this past August. She is a sister ship to 'Ester'. Scott discussed in short how he had repaired and brought Chloe to her current state.

Last up was the 30' sailboat that Scott bought from the insurance company after they had determined that the boat was totaled and they were sending her to salvage. Pictures were available of the boat in that condition, before Scott got his hands on her. He took a boat ready for the salvage yard and turned her into a Championship race boat.

Scott continued to answer questions and share his knowledge. He is a self-described 'putty and paint guy'. Scott admitted that he has no real desire to work on wood boats, wood trim and wooden engine boxes aside. His new description may now be that of 'a Tupperware boy'. Although new to the Antique and Classic Boat world, Scott brings a lot of knowledge and enthusiasm in the area of fiberglass boats. We all know that fiberglass is finding it's place and same arena as wood and is being welcomed into the world of The Antique & Classic Boat Society, Inc. Chloe turned a lot of heads at last year's Pewaukee show. Everyone attending the workshop/seminar enjoyed the time spent 'messing about in old boats'. A special thank you to Scott for putting on a fantastic workshop/seminar.

Restoration of a 1946 Gar Wood Ensign by Jim Ruwaldt



Jim Ruwaldt has been restoring a 1946 Gar Wood Ensign. He put on a new 5200 bottom, replaced numerous frames, etc. The upholstery is now being done along with rechroming and some engine details. With any luck it will be ready for the Madison Bost Show in August according to Ruwaldt.

Jim retired from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in 2009 where he had been in charge of the FWS private lands habitat restoration program across the state of Wisconsin. Much of the work that they did was directed at restoring wetlands which are important to maintaining and improving water quality. So, when the Clean Lakes Alliance was formed to work on improving water quality in the Madison Lakes, it was a natural connection according to Jim to become involved.

"I have always been interested in wooden boats. I built my first wooden boat, a duck boat, when I was 16. I renewed my interest in wooden boats and wooden boat restoration about 10 years ago when I bought a 14' cold molded plywood North American Marine runabout. I bought the Ensign from Dennis Evinrude in 2011 and have it just about done. It has a new 5200 bottom, many new frames, some new deck planking, new interior and rebuilt original Chrysler Ace engine. My plans are to have it in the water at the 2013 Madison Boat Show."
