





Tavares Under The Big Top

And you though you might read about a boat show here? Well, you will.....I'm just paraphrasing Terry Fiest chairman of the Tavares Florida Boat Festival I recently attended which quite coincidently was held on Lake Dora at Wooten Park this past March 25th thru 28th. The "Big Top" reference is to the Big White Tent that occupied the grounds on the south end of the park adjacent to trailer and "for sale" corral. That is the tent that from this year forward will house all general festivities other than the Thursday night gathering at the Lakeside Inn in Mt. Dora. Terry and his committee have decided to make every effort to make the evening functions as easy for boat show participants and show volunteers to get to with out having to rush home, change and then rush back to the more formal affairs of previous years.

And so, I found myself once again wandering the grounds on Thursday the 25th (setup day) and basking in the sunshine. I'll admit I had a slightly different motive to be there this year than last. This year Century Boats were the featured Marquee boat and just in case anybody doesn't know, yours truly is Treasurer and a director of the national Century Boat Club. Terry Fiest had assured us that he would provide us with a good time. He did.

Thursday night in spite of threatening weather forecasts, a multitude of the attendees assembled on the lawn and tennis courts of the Lakeside Inn in Mt. Dora where Hagerty Marine Insurance held a reception for those who had signed up to attend. I expected maybe a beer and some pizza slices. Instead I was offered the full requisite of cocktails, beer, wine and soft drinks. The appetizers turned out to be fully laden steam tables presenting a number of Italian cuisine offerings and Ceasar salad as well as cheeses and veggies.

On the lawn was the real treat for me. The Century Boat owners had been offered the opportunity to bring their boats to display on the lawn prior to launching on Friday. As I sat with Terry to discuss the turnout I discovered

he had expected maybe 6 to 8 boats to show up. We had 22 and quite a variety at that. That night I was told that of all the Marquee boats Sunnyland has featured, Century owner's topped the list in attendance numbers. I know for a fact that in addition to the 22 boats featured on the lawn that night another 10 or so had already been launched and were tied up at the display docks. And there also were a few mixed in with the Chris-Crafts and other varieties of beauties and potential beauties in the for sale corral.

The City of Tavares has spent \$4,000,000 over this past winter to improve Wooten Park. They've added a second ramp which is set at a shallow angle to allow modern sea planes to power up the ramp and park in the adjacent lot. A new marina building is nearing completion and that will house a store and marina headquarters. A second building set back a little further is also nearing completion and will house a restaurant and other facilities on the second floor. Finally a second new set of "B" docks with slips on all four legs of the "H" it forms has also been installed. Aviation Gas and Marine Gas pumps adorn a leg off of the new "H".

A fairly large contingent of construction workers was still laboring away on Thursday as I arrived. Workers were hammering and sawing and tractors and front end loaders were digging and earth moving and yet.....on Friday morning all construction efforts had come to a halt and the new marina building while not open yet almost looked like it was; with a few umbrellas and tables on the concrete patios leading up to the new steps to its deck.

Friday night we all gathered under the "Big Top" for drinks and more appetizers. Large round tables set under the white tent top allowed groups of people to gather and either get to know each other or get reacquainted. A presentation by the owner of Miss America IIV which was present and running at the show was fascinating. At no small cost I'm sure, original news reels of Gar Wood piloting the boat to some of its records had been saved and converted to disk. Terry Fiest also took the time to introduce his large crew of volunteers and some of the local city officials who had been invited to the festivities.

We journey up the river to the North Pier Terminal where there are plenty of boat parking for lunch.

This trip takes less than a hour from the ramp and will give you plenty of time to enjoy the sights of the city.

Lizzie Mc Neill's Irish Pub is on the river and a good place for lunch. The terminal charges \$20.00 an hour to park a boat so it's a little pricey, but there is no launch fee so it balances out.

I will ask for a donation to off set the cost of an off-duty police man who watch our cars and trailers while we are on the river.

The famous Eagle River chain of 28 lakes will be the site for the show scheduled for June 18, 19 and 20, 2010. It's the perfect secret getaway that Baby Face Nelson and Homer Van Meter would have loved. The event will be held on the grounds of the Wild Eagle Lodge on Duck and Lynx Lakes.
