This year we are going to hold the show over two (2) days, Friday and Saturday, June 25 & 26th 2021. This is going to be a busy weekend in the area so be sure to reserve hotel space immediately. In 2021, there is only one weekend between Fathers Day and July 4th and we are having the 2021 MACBS on that Friday and Saturday. We have decided to run the boat show later Saturday evening, until 8PM, and not to have the show on Sunday. **BOATMKE** Everyone gathered outside to hear from Ryan, Chris and Taylor. about the new boat rental business. They take 60's-70's fiberglass boats, fix them up and rent them on The Milwauke River chain. Retro Boat MKE, featuring two stylish classic boats, started renting in 2019. One was named Laverne and the other named Shirley. In a story, Milwaukee-area entrepreneur Redmond Tuttle said he would lease the two watercraft from Retro Boat Rentals in Saugatuck, Michigan. The local company now finds midcentury boats, restores them and outfits them with a motor.

Many people rented the boats in 2020 inspite of COVID. Renters being outdoors felt safer and generated business. They were originally using electric motors but were having problems keeping them charged. They are converting to low HP gas engines. A working arrangement has been worked out with AHB to restore these boats at their facility. Along with the stylish classic boats, donut boats were added to the rental mix.

The new facility has 8,600 sq ft (AHB) founded in May 2013, is a Milwaukeebased 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that exists to build the capacities, confidence. resilience, and futures of Milwaukee's youth through wooden boat building, work experiences, and on-the-water recreational activities. AHB teaches the craft of wooden boat building to support positive youth development, educational success, and workforce preparation, while youth also learn about Milwaukee's freshwater assets - our rivers and Great Lakes. Since its founding, AHB has led more than 2,500 Milwaukee-area youths in more than 100 boatbuilding projects. At All Hands Boatworks, it is about building more than a boat!

All Hands Boatworks instructs and mentors hundreds of youths (ages 10-17) annually through introductory boatbuilding residency programs, Carpentry Clubs, and on-water activities.

Bill said that a number of veterans are building boats to help them deal with stress from serving and to meet and build relationships with their fellow servicemen.

Andreas Jordahl Rhude, fifth of the six sons, started working at "**Unit Structures** "at age of 10 along with his older brothers. Andreas has worked every facet of production; driven truck; fixed roofs at the factory; done estimating and sales work; been a draftsman and prepared shop drawings; written press releases; published articles about the products and the history; and managed the entire operation.

Andreas said one of the most interesting and satisfying work done at the plant are glued laminated timbers for use in restoration of the historic sailing vessel **USS Constitution "Old Ironsides"** Since 1963 great and compass timbers have been made at Peshtigo for continued maintenance of the ship. From knees to hull and deck planking to masts, the Peshtigo plant has supplied all types of pieces for the ship. If you go to Boston Harbor, climb aboard "Old Ironsides"..... look for Andreas' hidden marking.
