



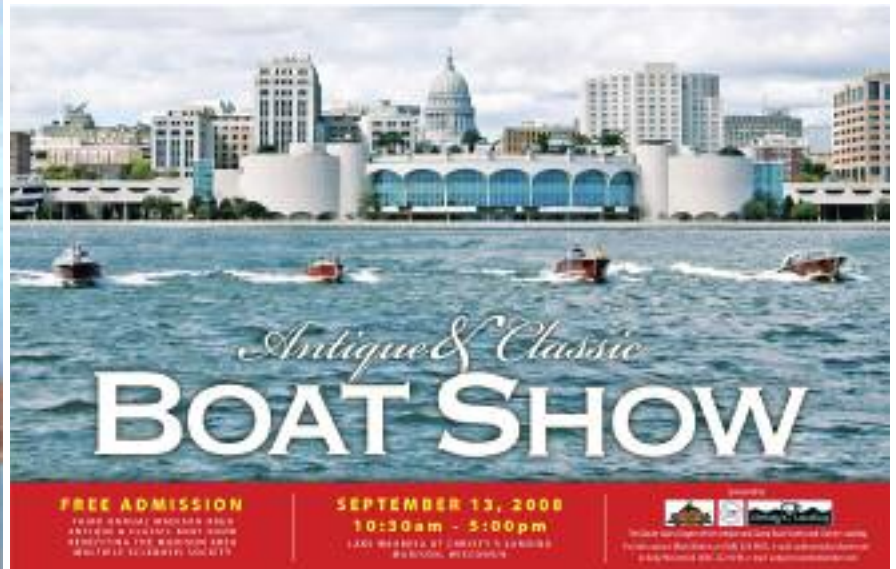
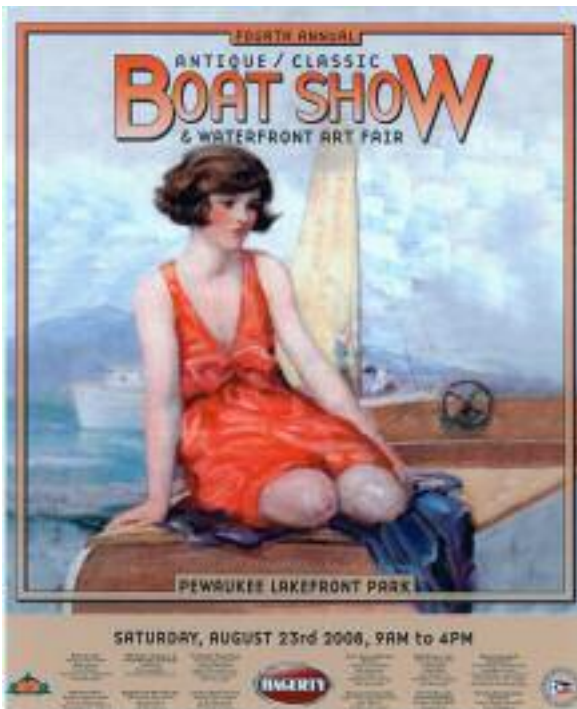

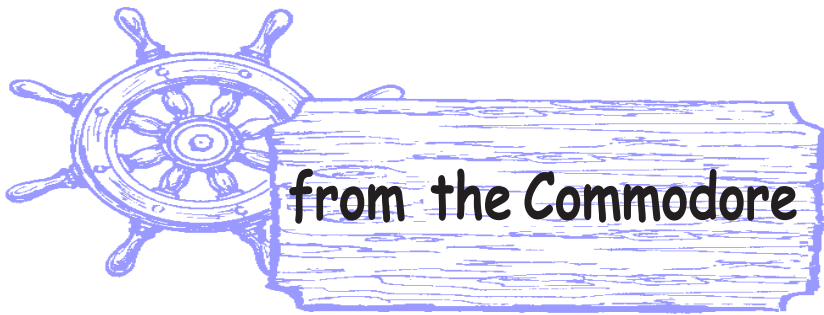

At the back end of this ACBS quarterly meeting, Karl Johns has worked on the catering for the Saturday cook out on Pewaukee Lake.

You'll find preliminary additional information on upcoming boat shows inside: The Eagle River Show benefiting special needs kids is June 19-21. The Blackhawk Chapter's Father's Day Cruise is June 15th. The Blackhawk 24th Annual Antique and Classic Boat show is Saturday July 19, in McHenry IL at Joey T's. The Minocqua Boat Show is July 25-27. For the first time, a pre-event cruise on the Minocqua chain is being planned. See details inside.

Boat on the Milwaukee River And Inner Harbor, Taste Milwaukee Beer,

Sail On A Great Lakes Schooner, Dine Like The Beer Barons Of Yesteryear, Find Out About Sunken Ships, Watch "Summerfest kick off" Fireworks Over Lake Michigan, Do More Boating, Learn The Ins And Outs Of Publishing Newsletters, Learn The Secrets Of Taking Better Pictures, And Meet New Friends !

WEDNESDAY evening-June 25, 2008-Arrive by car or plane. Better yet, bring your boat. Check in to The Astor Hotel, built in 1918, one of metro Milwaukee's historic jewels. Call toll free: 800-558-0200 Ask for the ACBS special rate.

THURSDAY June 26th-Early in the AM, there will be a launching of boats at The South Shore Yacht Club. You will Cruise the inner harbor and the Milwaukee River and enjoy lunch at one of the river front micro-brew restaurants.

After boating, you will return to The Astor, freshen up, and depart for The Wisconsin Club for a special evening. This was the home of Billy Mitchell's Grandfather, a prominent banker. Billy Mitchell is considered the Father of Air Power. The evening will include a tour of this beautiful turn of the century mansion and a talk by John Eastberg, a noted historian about Milwaukee, the famous Milwaukee Beer Barons. A sport coat is appropriate attire. You are in for a treat. Later that night, you will be bused back downtown to watch a fireworks extravaganza, the kick off to Summerfest and the ethnic festivals that lasts all summer long.

FRIDAY June 27th-Today you will be at Discovery World at Pier Wisconsin. About 9AM, you'll embark on the S/V Denis Sullivan, a replica 19th Century 137-foot Great Lakes Schooner for a 2 1/2 hour cruise. It accommodates 50 people. Register early. Boat rides will be available for those not able to make it on the S/V Denis Sullivan. Upon your return, you will enjoy a box lunch out on the pier. After lunch, you will learn about "The Ghost Ships of the Great Lakes!" Speakers will include Steve Daniel, President of The Great Lakes Shipwreck Preservation Society and Kimm Stabelfeldt of The Great Lakes Shipwreck Foundation. Learn first hand from the divers who search for the missing ships on The Great Lakes.

You will also want to check out the aquarium and the various exhibits at Discovery World. Other tours will be offered including a visit to the Art Museum next door. It is the first Santiago Calatrava-designed building in the United States, featuring a 90-foot high glass-walled reception hall enclosed by the Burke Brise Soleil, a sunscreen is raised and lowered daily, creating a unique moving sculpture.

The rest of the afternoon is yours following the Shipwreck presentations. Time permitting, you can do more boating. Friday evening, dinner will be on your own. You will be given a list of choice restaurants in the area.

Saturday June 28th-Today's agenda starts at The Milwaukee Yacht Club. The morning session will be a "Newsletter Work shop". Find out how the various chapters put together their newsletters, magazines and special boat show promotion sections. Find out what it takes to get advertiser support. Also find out what it costs to put out a chapter publication. There will be lots of samples and "How To" information sheets. A special session on "How To Take Good Pictures" presented by Jim Wangard, of Classic Boating will follow. The Directors meeting will follow. Participation is encouraged. There will be sightseeing for those not attending the sessions.

Pewaukee Lake Cookout After the ACBS Board meeting, afternoon transportation will be arranged to travel out to Pewaukee Lake for cocktails, boat rides, a cookout where you will meet old friends and make new ones. After all, it's a Gemütlichkeit weekend.

You have heard about this quarterly meeting for awhile now, and it is finally time to register!!

ACBS International President Gene Porter, along with the host chapters of Blackhawk and Glacier Lakes, invite you to attend the summer Board of Directors meeting in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. An exciting schedule of activities has been arranged, and you will thoroughly enjoy your time here!

Our host hotel in Milwaukee will be The Astor Hotel. Built in 1918, it is listed on the National Register of Historic Places in Milwaukee and is in a great location for our schedule. It is 15 minutes from the airport, and offers a complimentary shuttle within a 2 mile radius, which includes the Pabst Theatre and numerous galleries and museums. There is a room block in place for ACBS. Rooms will be released to the general inventory on May 10, 2008, so make your reservation early. The number is 1-800-558-0200 or 1-414-271-4220. The cost per room is \$109 per night.

The official meeting weekend schedule will begin on Thursday evening, June 26th. However, for those who wish to arrive by early Thursday morning, the host chapters invite you to join them for boating on the Milwaukee River and inner harbor, and to have lunch at a micro-brewery restaurant. You are invited to bring your boat. If unable to bring a boat, the chapters will arrange seats for all. Please note on the registration form if you will arrive early.

Thursday evening we will enjoy a grand evening at The Wisconsin Club, which was the home of Billy Mitchell's grandfather. Billy Mitchell is considered to be the Father of Air Power. Your evening's fee includes bus transportation from the hotel to the club, tours of the club, appetizers to accompany the cash bar, a lecture by noted historian John Eastberg on famous beer barons of Milwaukee, dinner, and transportation back to the hotel. Your night isn't over. On your return downtown, you will have the opportunity to watch a fireworks extravaganza over Lake Michigan, which is the kick off to Summerfest week and the ethnic festivals that last all summer long.

Dinner for Thursday evening will be:

- Stuffed Chicken Marsala – Wild mushroom dressing rolled inside boneless chicken sliced, fanned then finished with mushroom enhanced Marsala wine sauce and red jacket potatoes champignon. House Salad with House/French dressing, rolls, and beverage. Dessert will be an offering of Raspberry Sherbet with Gaufrette.
- We do have a vegetarian option available. (Eggplant, zucchini and yellow crookneck squash lightly tossed in olive oil and balsamic vinegar then chargrilled and stacked with sundried tomato concasse and baby mozzarella, accented with three cheese tortellini finished with Marinara sauce. This option also includes the House salad, rolls, beverage, and dessert.)

Friday will find us at Pier One/Discovery World – a fascinating array of museums and activities. We will embark in the morning on a cruise on the S/V Denis Sullivan (first 50 registrants only.) For those who register after the boat is filled, you will be able to register for the day's events as well, and be included for rides on escort boats. Bring your camera. Following the morning boating, we will have lunch on the pier, visit the theater for a special presentation by two speakers on Shipwrecks of the Great Lakes, and have time to visit the museums of Discovery World in the afternoon. *Dinner Friday evening will be on your own.*

Saturday we will be at The Milwaukee Yacht Club for our meetings. The Chapter Roundtable session will begin promptly at 8:00 a.m. with a special presentation on Chapter Publications and the "how to" questions. This is an interactive session with information and sharing between chapters and we do hope your chapter is represented! The Board of Directors meeting begins at 10:00 a.m.

Lunch on Saturday will be at noon, and you can sign up for the Clubhouse Sandwich of turkey, ham, swiss cheese, lettuce, tomato, smoked bacon and mayo, along with a beverage and cookies.

Following the completion of the meeting, we will be transported to Pewaukee Lake via bus for a late afternoon and evening of boating, BBQ, and great fellowship. We will leave to return to The Astor Hotel around 8:00 p.m.

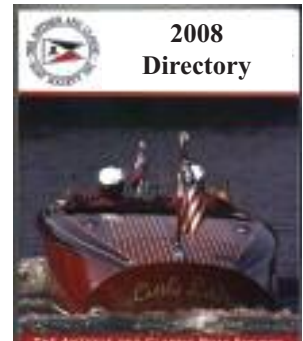

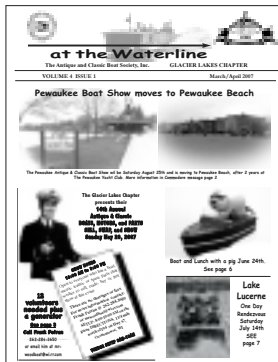

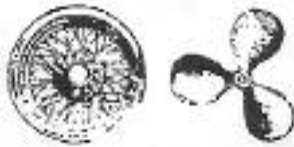
