The Presidents Cup is a special award given by the Commodore of each chapter each year. This is an ACBS award and this year I chose to give the award to **Don and Mary Schwister** for their extraordinary efforts in promoting the Pewaukee Boat Show, as well as for organizing the "honor guard ceremony" held at our 2011 & 2012 Pewaukee shows. Don has been able to involve **Dawes Crane** to assist in putting in and taking our the pier for the last two years and has been able to retrofit the trailers we haul the dock sections on. The "grunt" guys who are responsible for setting up the pier and taking it down are most grateful to Don. This year Mary brought "Thor" as a special exhibit.

Also acknowledged for his extraordinary effort was **John Constable** who has donated much of his promotional and advertising skills in the publicity area we need and has helped to grow this event. John has also become our "go-to" show announcer and his dulcet tones keep everyone up to the minute on what's going on and all the difference features of the many events going on during show day.

Good news on the Pewaukee show pier debt. Your board authorized the Pewaukee boat show committee recommendation of a payment of \$7,000.00 toward the pier debt. This is a direct result of the Pewaukee show activity in 2012. This payment reduced the pier debt to approximately \$1,232.00 – a debt we should easily be able to pay off in 2013. We will then look for other worthy causes to support with our show proceeds.

As a result of the Madison show this year, a \$4,000.00 plus contribution was made to the Clean Lakes Alliance . This partnership with the **Clean Lakes Alliance** will be in effect for 3 years.

A number of our members were in attendance at the Annual ACBS International meeting & boat show which was held at Big Cedar Lodge located 15 miles south of Branson Missouri. Wil & Mary Vidal, Howard & Donna Schneider, Rich and Beth Lepping, John & Amy Zea, and new Glacier Lakes members, Glen & Nancy Hubbard. Also at the event were Glacier Lakes members, Don & Bonnie Bergman from Marshfield, WI. Rich Lepping has also been elected to the ACBS board of directors.

Finally, our next event will be the Greater Milwaukee Boat show at State Fair Park in West Allis. The dates are January 18th through the 27th. Set up day will be Thursday, the 17th. As we have usually done in the past – we will cover the details at our January 6 Sunday brunch meeting at The **Delafield Brewhaus**. See back page for details. Remember this show is a fun event at which we have a number of boats on display and a rotating staff of members to man the booth. We are a great attraction and that is why we have been invited back each year. May you all have a wonderful Holiday season dreaming of the ice going out and that first boat ride of the new season in 2013. See you in January.

On Friday, November 9, 2012, a group of Madison Area Antique and Classic Boat Show (MAACBS) organizers attended the Yahara Lake Community Breakfast at the Monona Terrace Community and Convention Center to support the Clean Lakes Alliance (CLA). Abbreviated meeting minutes provided by Sue Rechcygl
