In addition to an Air Show that weekend, the U.S. Navy will be in port with about seven vessels. Up to five Tall Ships will also be part of the celebration. This will be part of the annual Milwaukee Air & Water Show. The difference is that The US Navy has chosen Milwaukee to be one of 16 American Cities taking part in the commemoration of the bicentennial of the War of 1812. Milwaukee's part in the festivities will be August 7-12 Many activities are planned for the week.

Jeff Phillips said he is working on dockage slip arrangements to accommodate up to 28 antique & classic boats at Discovery World plus an area for a land display of boats.

Jack Schneiberg contacted Mark Svoboda, President of Blackhawk to see if they would like to partner for this event. Mark checked with the Blackhawk board and membership and they said they would love to get involved with this unique show.

Our part will be Saturday and Sunday August 11 and 12. The boats would arrive on Friday, August 10. You will be kept informed as the plans take shape on Discovery World's side. Hopefully more details will be available at the spring meeting and banquet.

Glacier Lakes Spring Meeting Friday April 20th at The Delafield Brewhaus SPECIAL PROGRAM: Secrets of Great Lakes Ghost Ships

EDMUND FITZGERALD: Arguably the most famous ghost ship of the Great Lakes, this ore freighter sank in Lake Superior on November 10, 1975 and all 26 crewman were lost. It is not known fully what happened that fateful night in 1975

EMPEROR STEAMER: A diver exploring the ship's wreckage in 1988 saw the ghost of a crewman laying on his bunk, who then rolled over and looked at him, appearing as he would have before the ship sank - then just vanished!

GRIFFON: The Griffon set sail from Green Bay into Lake Michigan in September 1678 and was never seen again.

Kimm Stabelfeldt holds one of the largest private collections of Great Lakes books and ephemera in Wisconsin and is the author of five popular Great Lakes dive guides. Mr. Stabelfeldt's work has been published in numerous periodicals. He is a Director of the Great Lakes Shipwreck Research Foundation, Inc. which holds the annual Ghost Ships Festival each year in Milwaukee. A certified Extended Tri Mix diver, Kimm Stabelfeldt is the president of Adventure Diving, Inc., a Great Lakes shipwreck dive charter service, and President of DBD Consulting. He holds degrees in Business and Computer Science and is an executive business consultant.





This is the story of two guys – Jack & Dave – who travel Wisconsin in a van (my Town & Country) to scrounge for stuff to buy cheap; most of which we didn't know we needed until we spotted it. The concept sounds so good that I'm thinking of trying to sell it to the History Channel.

The Antique Outboard Motor Club International (AOMCI) holds an annual swap meet and show in Tomahawk, Wisconsin each year and this was my second visit to the affair. On Wednesday morning, July 27th, we hooked up Dave Doyle's Switzer Craft Baby Bullet to my van and proceed to an area commonly

That steak kept me up a good part of the night and so I was surprised when I felt raring to go the next morning as we drove back to the meet and went on another walking trip up and down the aisles. The inn has a nice outside deck on which one can sip a drink and eat dinner while watching the activity on the river. We did just that in spite of a thunderstorm that came through.
