NEW MEMBER PROFILE



Andy and Brittney Hacker 1977 Aristocraft Nineteen PEWAUKEE, WI

My Grandfather bought the '77 WT/BR (white with brown color scheme on the boat) with the 165hp Mercruiser brand new and was a gentleman that enjoyed working more than playing. He had a family of five and rarely took time to relax but insisted on acquiring toys. He owned and operated his own, and quite successful, trucking and grading business and had a shop for all of his equipment. He stored the '77 in that shop for it's entire life and racked up a total of about 20 engine hours on the vessel and kept it in showroom condition. About seven years before he passed away (2015), he planned to sell the boat and had it out for a sea trial after a thorough cleaning. I helped him with this process and it was tortuous. I was fresh out of college and didn't have the money to make a real offer so I helped prepare the boat to make a sale. The boat performed flawlessly! Luckily (for me), the deal fell through.

I have been obsessed with "Grandpa's Boat" for my entire life. I recall a time when I was four or five years old being out on it with my parents for a ride. That was the last memory I had of the boat being in the water before the most recent sea trial and my Grandmother confirmed that to be truth. After Grandpa passed away in November of 2015, my Grandmother asked if I would be interested in the boat. I assured her that I was interested in the vessel and purchased the boat in the fall of 2016. My plan is to make this boat a floating preservation over the winter and to ensure it performs as good as it looks. The boat runs, floats, and flies across the lake but I want to make sure it is in tip top mechanical shape after all of that sitting. The 2016/2017 winter will be the time to make all of the necessary adjustments and repairs

For the past several years I have been building boats in a dedicated 1600 sq ft. warehouse space. Recently I caught the CC bug after visiting Minnesota and looking at a few utilities. We ended up purchasing a 23' 1952 Holiday. The boat remains in Minnesota for an engine rebuild and will be delivered in the Spring.

Looking for a new project, we recently picked up an 18' CC Riviera gray boat. The boat is all original and no work appears to EVER have been done on it. It will be re-skinned and a 5200 bottom installed. The optimistic goal is to have this boat on the water by June of 2017.

Both the Chris Craft and the Trojan are used frequently on the Mississippi River near our home. We purchased the Constellation in 2003 in fair condition and have made numerous improvements since then. The hull has been refastened and, of course repainted. Surprisingly, there was no rot on any plank, frame or plywood. However, the same was not true of the deck which needed total replacement. The new deck is black locust rather than the original teak and looks good. We have also totally refinished the interior with new stain and varnish. With these improvements (and numerous lesser projects), we have a nice cruiser which we use for picnics, swimming, and overnights. This boat is our favorite but given its size cannot be easily hauled for boat shows.

The Trojan was a project boat. Originally, the boat was purchased by the father of a friend who used it on Lake Winnebago for many years. The boat was kept in the family but not used for decades. Luckily, it was

housed in a barn in Harpers Ferry, Iowa for 20 plus years before it was given to me for the price of 2 tires which were mounted on the ancient boat trailer on which the Trojan sat. When I received it (in the early 2000s), it sat in my shed for years as I intended to restore it upon retirement. However, retirement never came and I took the Trojan to Brightworks Boat Shop in Madison for the work. The photo shows the results.

This Trojan was manufactured in Lancaster Pennsylvania in 1957. The hull is plywood and the deck is mahogany. The boat was in good shape when we received it except the transom which was replaced by Brightworks. Of course, the entire boat was repainted and varnished. The hull was originally painted black and apparently was called the "Black Marlin" model. I did not receive the outboard with the boat and have mounted a new 40hp Mercury on it. We use the boat frequently on the Mississippi and hopefully will bring it to a few ACBS cruises.

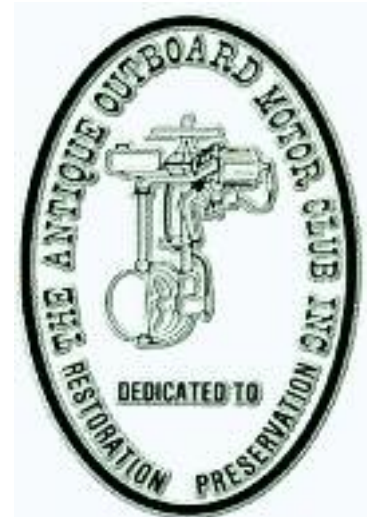
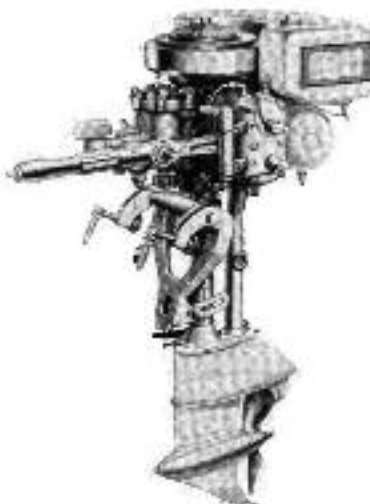

The Story of Honor Flight

Stars and Stripes Honor Flight is a tax-exempt, non-profit, registered 501 (c) 3 organization whose mission is to honor our veterans by flying WWII, Korean and terminally ill veterans from all conflicts to visit their memorials in Washington DC at no cost to the veteran. We actively support educational aspects of our mission to school groups and our communities. We are a volunteer based organization, entirely funded by donations from individuals, small and large groups as well as corporate sponsorships with \$0.98 of every dollar donated going to flying veterans.

The Honor Flight story began in 2005 with a man named Earl Morse, a physician assistant and private pilot, who was working with veterans at a VA medical center in Ohio. After the WWII memorial was dedicated in May of 2004 he began asking the veterans if they would travel to see their memorial and many were sadly not able to do so on their own, either financially or physically. Earl offered to fly a veteran to Washington DC for the day and it was such a success that he was convinced this was something that needed to be continued. By the end of 2005, with the help of eleven pilots from his aviation group, 137 WWII veterans flew to Washington DC.... Honor flight was born! Currently the Honor Flight network is active in over 40 states with more than 130 hubs across the country.

Stars and Stripes Honor Flight originated in 2008 in Port Washington. Our hub covers the southeastern counties and part of northern Illinois and is one of 5

hubs in Wisconsin. As of November 2016 we have flown 37 missions and sent a total of 4,818 veterans to visit their memorials in Washington D.C.

An Honor Flight day starts at 5am when the veterans begin to arrive at the airport with or to meet their guardian for the day. After getting their boarding pass, they have their photograph taken and pick up a breakfast before boarding the plane.

When we land in Washington D.C. we are greeted by a welcoming crowd and loaded onto busses. Park police escort us from place to place throughout the day; stopping traffic to allow us to pass easily through the city...the veterans love this! The memorials we visit on every trip are the

WWII memorial, Korean memorial,

Iwo Jima memorial and Arlington Cemetery for the changing of the guard as well as other monuments as time permits.

After a very full and busy day we arrive back in Milwaukee and the veterans are welcomed home by family, friends and military as they are escorted through the airport for an Honor Flight homecoming parade.

The Honor Flight day is a uniquely fulfilling experience for our heroes and one they will remember and talk about for the rest of their lives. It often opens up conversations about their service days, which many have never spoken of to family and friends. Help us continue our mission by thanking a veteran you encounter and ask them if they have been on an Honor Flight.
