

John's presence on the lake and his family eventually living every summer on Okauchee is what kick-started his love of boats especially the classic boats we all so dearly love. There was a lively character on the lake we all knew quite well who especially peaked John's interest in wooden boats. We know this man as Carl Johns who also hosted so many epic gatherings at his wonderful property. Together these two free spirits chased down many a boat lead and enjoyed life to the fullest!

John's involvement with our Glacier Lakes Chapter has been nothing short of extraordinary. He has always considered himself a behind the scenes kind

Speaking of the show it was John's great joy to give the uninitiated crazy rides in his latest finds. Amy would shrug her shoulders when John would bring another "orphan" home to add to his growing collection of boats. Although on the inside she loved it because of the excitement and fulfillment it would bring to her husband. John was still very active till the day he died adding to his ever expanding montage of boats and cars. Never one not to share his enthusiasm John would throw open his museum quality boat and car storage facilities for all to see and enjoy. These of course where done in conjunction with fabulous parties overseen by Amy! Thankyou for that John and Amy! His sons, Matt and Jacob have also really embraced the family tradition with Matt actually living on site. I could go on and on about John's assembly of rare pedigrees but that might be better served with a layout in the future in The Classic Boat Magazine published locally. John was at his best when he was sharing his deep knowledge and love of boats. His expertise will be a real loss to our chapter.

This special "gentleman" in every aspect that comes with the term was a rare one for sure. He was a man of few words at times and we all knew them. His favorites where three in short order-"Amy", "Nope" and "Yup!" At other times he had more words such as when he was straightening out a young impertinent hockey youngster! He certainly had a positive influence on so many lives. Ever since I knew John he was a man of God. He was a strong Catholic his entire life and he led his life accordingly. A real tribute to his faith was a quote from Amy. " He made his own death so much easier for us in his steadfast belief he was going to a better place and we will all be together some day with our Savior." Amy believed that and we shouldn't worry. We will be just fine. John's "legacy" is already fulfilled. As John aspired to be a leader and he was that and more he influenced the rest of us to be the best we could be. For that we are very grateful. John K. Zea you will be missed greatly and remembered fondly by all.
