### "NIKKO" 1961 Arkansas Traveler "Frolic" Micki & Jim Reinardy of Mequon

This 15' "Frolic" model was introduced in 1961. Nikko is equipped with a cloud white 1959 Kiekhaefer Mark 58AEL w/Mercury Super Thunderbolt Powerhead which is rated at 45 HP. The Mark 58AEL designates it as Electric Starting, Long Shaft with Alternator.

"NIKKO" was pulled from Micki's dad's garage in 2021. Nikko was a big part of Micki's family's summer recreation on Lake Winnebago from 1967- 1972. Needing some repairs, she was stored in an offsite garage and largely forgotten. With a few fiberglass patches in the hull, replacement of rotted floor boards, plus a new starter motor and magneto for the outboard, she is now a fun ride and eye-catching retro runabout for our family. We look forward to spending more time on the water with her and many cosmetic projects ahead.





The "Wisconsin Scale Boating Association" always has a fantastic display of model boats at the show. This boat was built by Paul Simon: The ship is a 1:48 scale model of the USS Johnston, a WW2 era American destroyer. It is 8 feet long and weighs 50 pounds (20 pounds of that is ballast) when I put it in the water. The entire ship (aside from the electronics, paint, and some stiffeners etc) was 3D printed. Working off of pictures and 1:48 scale detailed blue prints I created all the parts in CAD using SolidWorks modeling software [~250 hours]. Then I printed the parts using my filament and resin 3D printers. Generally the machines run when I'm asleep or gone for the day but regardless it took about 350 hours of machine time to make all the parts. Finally another 200 hours to assemble and paint all the individual parts. There was some trial and error involved too as I wasn't even sure the best way to build it. It took me about a year working off and on before I had something to put into the water that would run. The last six months I have been adding more details and correcting some mistakes. It's almost done, it just needs lighting and some railings on the decks. Cost? \$600-700...just like "real" boats I'd almost prefer not to know.

Why this particular ship? I did not even know the story of the USS Johnston until another WSBA club member suggested it would be a good choice, and he was right. It was sunk in 1944 during the Battle of Leyte Gulf. I placed 186 crewmen on deck which looks a bit crowded but back then that's generally how it was done. More importantly there is one figure for each person that died as a result of the ship sinking. The 141 survivors spent 50 hours in the water before they were rescued. It is truly a story of ordinary people doing heroic things. **By Paul Simon**

# MEMBER PROFILE - JOHN BAUMANN



### 1938 Chris Craft 15 ½' Deluxe Runabout OWNER John Baumann

1938 was the first year that this model was built. Only 35 were made that year.

The production of this model stopped in 1941, and the total number of these boats that were made was 671. It has a model BA engine which had an aluminum head on the engine providing an additional 5 HP bringing it to 65 hp versus the model B with only 60 hp. This was my very first Chris Craft. She was found just outside of Minocqua, Wisconsin. It was purchased in Chicago, and shipped to Minocqua for use at the family's sum-

mer cottage. When found, the hull needed paint, the engine didn't run, the seats were shot, and the varnish needed a little freshening up, but she was a cute little thing. I put in new points, painted the hull, reupholstered the seats, and enjoyed her for the next 18 years on Okauchee Lake without a problem. For her 72d birthday, I decided to restore her, and rebuild her original engine. After a 2 year "vacation", she was ready for another 72 years of boating
